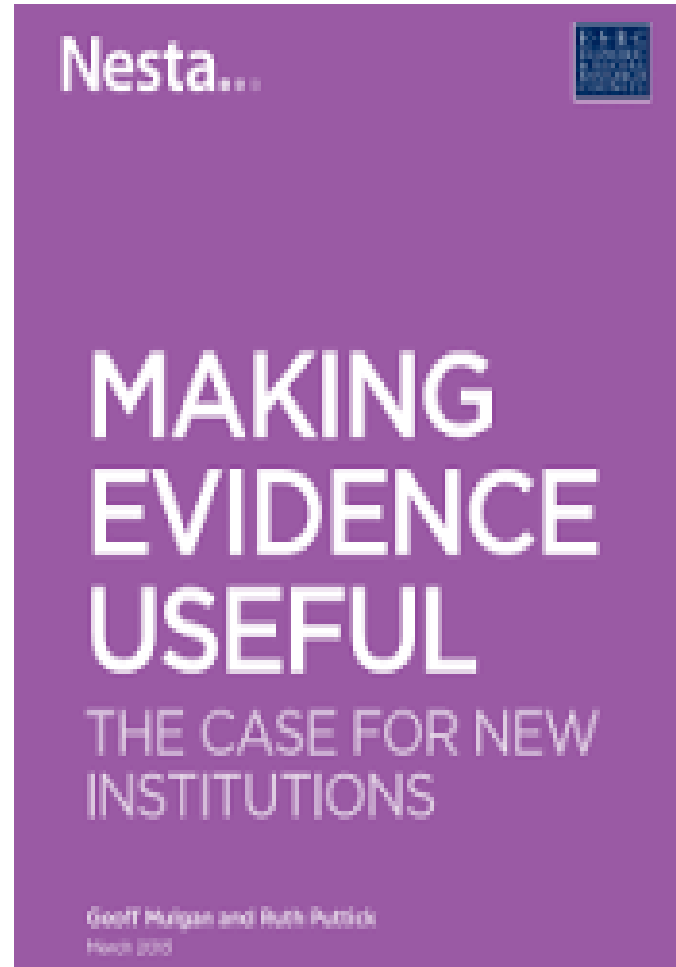

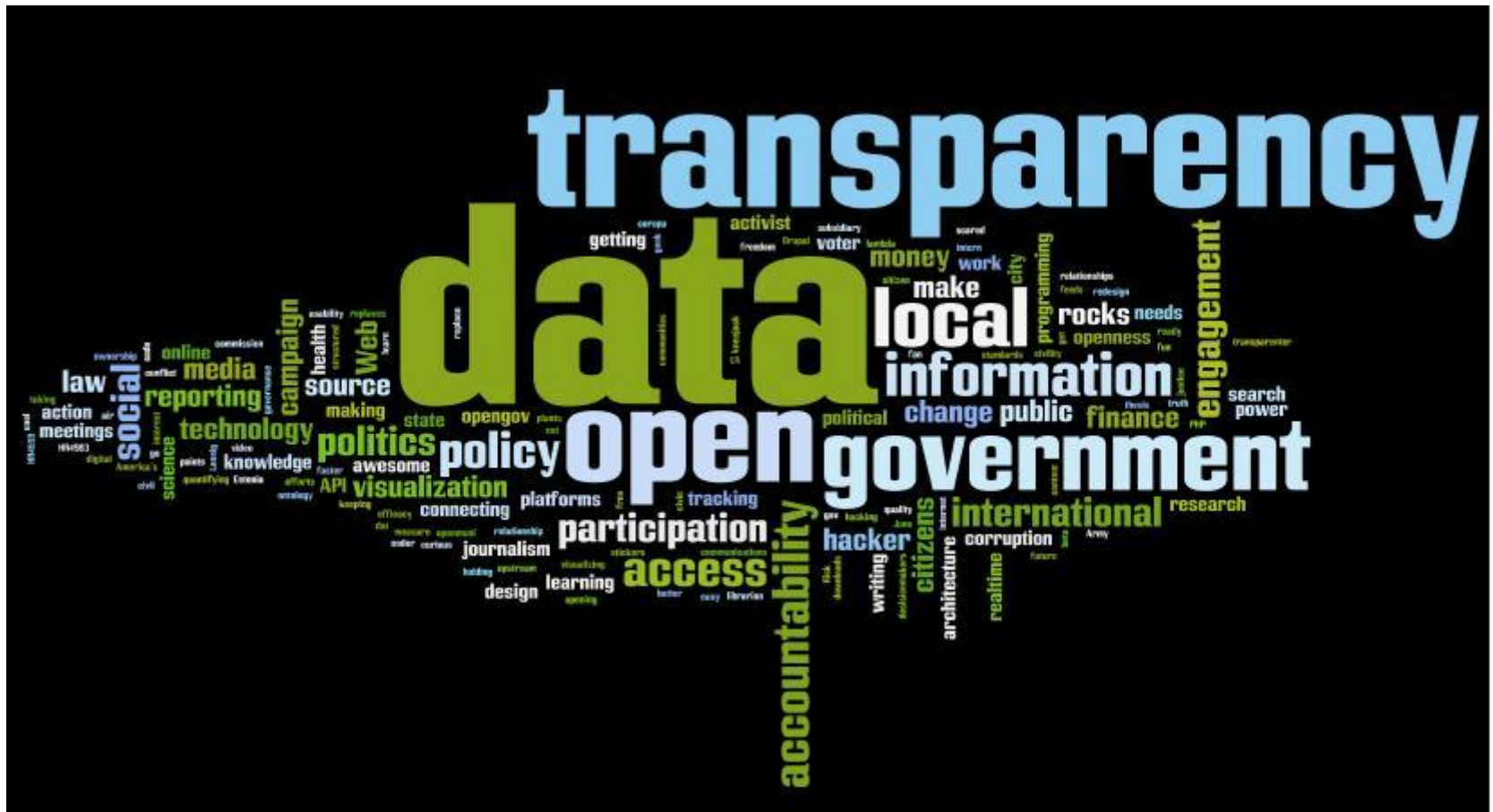

Regulating for Engagement

- Focus is on process rather than outcomes
- Codified rules of participation and process
- Seeks behaviour modification amongst all parties
- Engages both regulator and regulated in a negotiated process
- Continuous 'reflexive' learning process
